### **OBJECTIVES:**

To provide information and guidance of the process for handling Red Light, Speed Camera and Traffic Infringement Notices.

### **PRINCIPLES:**

Registered owners of vehicles detected by cameras will be issued with a Camera Detected Traffic Infringement Notice through the Mail. The Infringement Notice will automatically be issued in the name of the Council to which the vehicle is registered.

The Council has three options upon receipt of the Infringement Notice:-

1. Nominate the driver of the vehicle (notice will be issued to nominated driver);
2. Pay the fine indicated on the notice (while Council will not incur demerit points, fines are 5 times the value of the corresponding fine applied to an individual);
3. Elect for a Court Hearing.

A Traffic Infringement Notice will be issued on the spot for manually operated speed detection radar.

### **POLICY**

Upon receipt of a Camera Detected Traffic Infringement Notice the Chief Executive Officer will nominate the driver of the subject vehicle who will then be responsible for the associated offence. Traffic Infringement Notices will be the responsibility of the driver of the vehicle.
