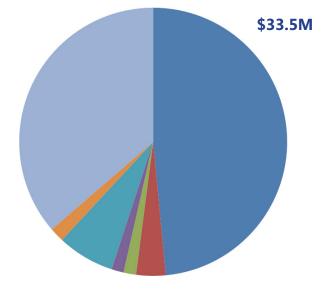
BUDGET 2017/2018

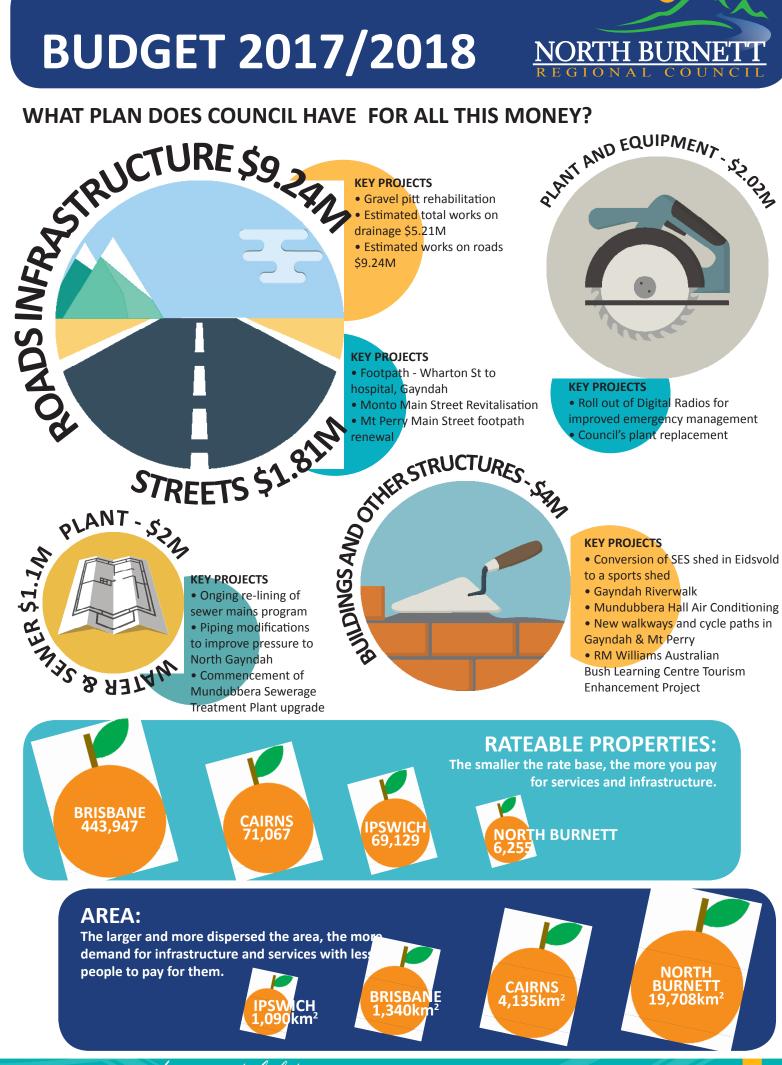
